1) Holy Week liturgy. Holy Family is known locally as the place to be on Holy Week. I see Christian friends from all kinds of denominations at CHF on Holy Week. I think it shows how committed we are to worshiping God, and how central the Resurrection is to our life.

2) Outreach. I have never been in a church that offered more ways to get your hands dirty serving others. I quickly got roped into Yokefellows and Transition Ministry. Now, I count among my best friends felons and drug addicts and poor teenagers with babies. It's exploded my rather safe middle-class existence. Our church is not that diverse (in terms of social class), but the opportunities for outreach have brought me face to face with the poor, the imprisoned, and the needy. And there I see Christ.

1) Baptism. The way we gather around the font and immerse and liberally sprinkle holy water afterward demonstrate that we really believe what the liturgy says. I've been in so many churches that acted like they wanted to rush through the baptism. It was some annoying interruption in the service. But I love baptisms at Holy Family.

2) Commitment to outreach. The quite severe cut into the recent outreach budget notwithstanding, CHF has always valued outreach and given a larger percentage of its budget than other churches. I value how active Holy Family is in the community. And I value the church's attempt to get more of the members involved in outreach.

3) That we seem to be more focused on prayer than programs. The feel of life at CHF is liturgical and ancient and mystical, whereas so many churches have the feel of corporations -- with programs and agendas and CEOs, etc. I like that Holy Family is very active. There's someone at the building doing something every day. The doors are always open. But it doesn't feel like a business. It's not about job titles and programs. It's about prayer and outreach.

3/12/2010

The first parish weekend my family attended in 2007 was awesome. (We did not attend this year.) All the educational opportunities were great, and I really admire parish members who led classes.

The service in which the newly released prisoner was baptized was very moving. I think the members of the prison ministry team are doing God's work.

I value the consistency of the message; of sticking to scripture and enlightening me with its meaning each Sunday.

I value the Sunday school and youth Journey in Faith programs.

I value the feeling of being part of a family outside my own little world.

3/12/2010

When my wife and I left St. Philip's we came to Church of the Holy Family very simply because we are Bible based faithful Christians, and we knew our Brother Timothy was a True Believer, always faithful, always loving and trusting God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit always loving and forgiving others, never judging. I know Timothy believes in the true healing God and in the universal centrality and truth of Holy Communion, the Body of Christ, the unity sharing of Christ Jesus who gave his Blood and Body for us, for all of us, now and forever, all persons of faith throughout the world. sharing the common cup, kneeling, asking God and receiving as infinitum everlasting and equal understanding, mercy, and forgiveness. CTHF has led Missions in our community and all over the world, sending out not just money but people of faithful love and service, real Christians, serving and helping those less fortunate, poor, hungry, thirsty, imprisoned and ill, as we all have at one time or another needed God's love and forgiveness and it has been given, and we have been forgiven and fed in body and in spirit. Holy Family is everything a church should be, people adopting children from other countries, fellow communicants going to Haiti, Africa, Phillipines, or local prisons; it is an amazing, united, blessed, place, a truly, united in Communion Holy Family. We were united. Timothy avoided the inherent new changes in the national church, but he was truly faithful. He welcomed all people, whatever their color, financial status, educational status, or sexual orientation to CTHF and to Holy Communion, and he sincerely cared about us, all of us. Timothy to my knowledge did not personally, privately, or publically, advocate, bless or unify same sex unions, but he was not a public fundamentalist or conservative, and bless him, he refused to leave or to further divide us from the Episcopal Church of the USA. He was loved and respected by clergy and laity throughout the national church and the Anglican Communion. He walked a thin brave line, which made me, and my wife, more comfortable about staying in a church that my family have been members of since 1620. He gave us a place we could worship, and we were able to avoid the never ending in your face advocacy, and find peace, in a place of worship that never deviated from Biblical Word and teachings, Bible based authority, and the true Word of God. Now, with more direct influence of Bishop Curry, we are troubled the Search Committee could select someone less loving and less fundamentalist and less faithful and true in his or her beliefs, so we will have to pray about it and just hope that God's will become known in the process, which process is going to be very difficult, because Timothy was very special.

3/13/2010 My children and I have been worshiping at Holly family for a year and 3 months now. We came following an invitation by Chris And Keizia Clopp, a former divinity student. We were worshiping at the united Methodist church at the time and were having some second thoughts about our place of worship. We walked in to Holly family on a Sunday after Christmas and as soon as our feet entered the Nave we felt a great sense of holiness and awe.. the worship service was amazing and we could hardly wait to come back the next Sunday and see if what we experienced was just one moment in time or an ongoing presence.. It felt like "the family of God", as my 15 year old daughter said. The weekly communion was new to us , now i cannot imagine having worship without it. It is my first Episcopal experience. Every time we baptize a baby in the font, and the new naked little Christian is pulled from the waters, I believe there really is a new birth. Baptisms and the Eucharist are the first most important moments here. I also think about Parish Weekend 2007 and the evensong afterward, when we gathered and studied and seemed to all want to move forward together following former ABC Carey's teachings, reaching out to the fringes. After that, there seemed to be a lot of growth in learning and studying for awhile, and I felt as though God's work was being done by feeding God's sheep. The other moment that comes to mind is Pentecost a couple of years ago when we had the intergenerational event in the parish hall. So many people participated, giving their gifts, and there seemed to be a light shining there, showing how God was already at work among us and drawing us into fuller life. I guess the places I see us doing God's work the most are those places where I see most clearly how God is working among us, when we pay attention to the glory and love and forgiveness and beauty of God in the sacraments and in our daily lives. The strength, courage, love, and joy we take out into the world at the Eucharist has been visible when we took time to build one another up.

Eucharists every Sunday and on feasts (Especially the fact that we don't shy away from the traditional language [I'm a Rite 2er, so I don't mean "thou's"], but try to live into it as a challenge and opportunity for growth. I have no taste for innovative language trends that disregard the use of the Triune name.) I like that we feel welcome to have our children with us and to teach them what is going on. There are always those moments before us, when we bring the world into God and then through the prayers witness a transformation, so that God's world ("of thine own have we given thee") becomes God's gift of himself for us ("the gifts of God for the people of God"). How much cooler can you get? Everything that God has to give is offered to us in that little piece of Jesus bread. That changes everything, really. In other words, I am very grateful we are committed to frequent Eucharists.

Christian Education: I think we do Children's Christian Ed pretty well and are improving, and I would love to see a deeper commitment to the formation of adults. With the children, we use creativity and whole-person teaching methods much more.

I feel as though the last one has to be a toss-up between music and fellowship. I love that we incorporate a variety of musical traditions, and music is important to me as a musician. But I get a lot out of the choir meals on Wednesday evenings, too. I would love to see a tradition of post-liturg tea and cookies or similar to spring up. The closest we get to that is the lemonade on the porch in summertime, I think.

Patricia Medor's wake. James Laskowski's burial. Maundy Thursday Vigil. Easter Vigil. Holy Eucharist as often as possible. What makes us a Holy Family? What brings us together and makes us holy? 1. Holy Eucharist: Rite II: Prayers A, B, and D. I value that as Episcopalians we inherit Eucharistic Prayers from the Scottish Episcopal Church and thus from the Liturgy of St. Basil. I feel this tradition has played a central role in forming us as a Holy Family because it emphasizes the whole prayer as the work of the people and the Holy Spirit.
2. Baptism by Full Immersion: We baptize the whole person. We dunk the entire human under the water. The old human is drowned. Dead! We then raise the dead person to Life in Christ. New Creation! Reborn by the Holy Spirit. We soak the whole person in the Holy Spirit and by God's unfathomable grace, we as a Holy Family participate in the creation of a new being. I would love to see more Adult Christian Education on the theology of Full Immersion Baptism in the near future.
3. Sanctity of Marriage: The Sacrament of Marriage between a man and a woman as a symbol of humankind being made in the Image of God. The symbol of the love between Christ the King and His Church (the Queen). The sanctity of the sacrament of Christian Marriage goes hand-in-hand with Full Immersion Baptism. Christ is ours and we are His. In the present age, there are those who will say that the body does not matter, that only the mind and the heart matter. In Baptism we use molecules of H₂O to soak people's physical bodies in the Holy Spirit. In Holy Eucharist, we use physical bread and wine to consume the Body and Blood of Christ. In Holy Matrimony, we make holy the joining of a man and a woman that they may become one flesh. We are commanded by our LORD to love all people, regardless of the nature of their desires. However, this should not include changing the meaning of Christian Marriage or introducing "Same Sex Unions" into the BCP.

* I would like to see Holy Family get more involved in local outreach ministries in Durham and Orange County. For example, Housing for New Hope, Orange/Durham Coalition for Battered Women, and providing assistance to the unemployed.

* Improved Adult Education Offerings - tap Diocesan resources for new ideas and presenters.

We feel that change has been a big part of our lives as a christian family and learning to trust Jesus can be hard at times.. but praying together, reading the bible and serving others has always brought us to some amazing places in life we never thought possible..

It is my hope for the Church of the Holly family that we will embrace this change, no matter how uncomfortable it might make us.. and allow the spirit to help us grow in our trust and love of Jesus for the Glory of his kingdom. Amen.

Building up small groups to help people find God's presence in their daily lives. I think that we will probably reach out more to the surrounding neighborhoods in the coming years as well, so I expect that we will grow numerically in part by adding more families from Asian countries and perhaps other minorities. I want to see Holy Family as a place of spiritual refuge and challenge to young parents as well. I believe that small group ministries can help to reach out more to our neighbors and to the tired parents as well.

If Holy Family manages to avoid the siren song of politics and refrains from taking sides in the ill-considered debates on gay marriage so as to focus on the important topics of Christian formation and growth in the Spirit and struggle against sin, I would be very glad indeed. I think that most of the mess passed off as theology on these controversial topics is actually just sound bites, disguising real issues and pastoral needs. I would like to see some serious discussions and theological reflection on human nature (theological anthropology), grounded in the tradition, taking into account the fact that Americans do not have the only legitimate system of classifying psychiatry and sexual identities, and using the history of the church and our prayers to inform a less binary, more holistic, more holy view of human nature. Something with which we can work when we do the church's work of liturgy.

When our organ is filled out, we can have much better music, and more musicians will be drawn to our parish. I would like to see the greater integration of music and other creative outlets (drawing, iconography, dance) in our parish life as a way to deepen our lives and loves with God and with one another.

I really value the prayer team and the fostering of belief that God heals people today. I hope that our next rector encourages the prayer teams and parish prayer life through announcing the prayer team's presence, supporting and/or participating in studies on prayer, and continuing the tradition of healing services each month.

I think that Nancy Bryan and Paul Cizek are doing great jobs in Christian Ed and youth ministry, and I hope and pray that our future rector will value them as well.

Could someone please write the end year on Fr. Timothy's portrait in the hall? It's misleading to have 1989-____, and it doesn't help us move on in our grief and growth.

1. No Fear: We must not be afraid to grow in size and as a family. We must not be afraid to die as a family. We must not be afraid to allow God to completely reshape us. We must be in continual repentance, always turning away from sin and back to God. We must be willing to accept that some of our favorite causes may not be where God is leading the community. The most common feedback we received through the years was that folks wished the small group experience from Journey in Faith could continue after the last JIF session ended. The second most common feedback was that folks wished the material could have gone further in-depth. The third most common was that the information that was presented in JIF was not accessible enough

or that JIF was at an inconvenient time. I think these responses are indicative of 2 things: 1) we need to make some improvements in our Adult Christian Ed offerings including JIF and a follow-on to JIF, and 2) for a parish of our size we need an
